**Imagination Library** is a free book-gifting program founded by Dolly Parton. Each month, enrolled children receive a new book in the mail, along with a reading tip sheet that helps parents enjoy reading with their child.

In Australia, the program is run by **United Way Australia** in partnership with government, councils, businesses and community groups.

**Imagination Library Kippax** is facilitated by **A Village for Every Child** and partner organisations to support early literacy at home, foster a love of reading and strengthen family connection.

## Why Imagination Library Kippax?

Each family you help enrol strengthens your connection with the community, builds trust with families and helps create the conditions for children to thrive.

## Your role as an Enrolling Partners

As an enrolling partner, your service plays a vital role in connecting families to the Imagination Library Kippax program. You will:

- Identify eligible families within your service.
- Explain the program and support families to complete the enrolment form.
- Submit the completed forms to Libraries ACT.
- Stay connected with enrolled families to promote regular reading.
- Support families to update their contact or address details.
- Let the families know their first book may take up to two months to arrive.

## Who is eligible?

Families with children from birth to 3 years old, living in **Holt, Higgins, Latham, MacGregor, Charnwood, Dunlop and Strathnairn.**
